



# UNIFORM SCHENGEN TRANSPORT VISA

<b>Visa Type:</b>	Uniform Schengen Visa (type "C")
<b>Length of stay:</b>	up to 90 days over a 180 days period
<b>Entrances:</b>	1, 2 or multiple entries
<b>Time requirements for submitting the application:</b>	no earlier than six months and at the latest 15 calendar days before the start of the planned trip
<b>Deadline for completion of the procedure:</b>	15 days extendable up to 45 in the cases provided for by Article 23 of the Visa Code)

## GENERAL OVERVIEW

The transport visa allows entry, for a short stay, for the purpose of carrying out professional activities related to the transport of goods or passengers, by land (truck drivers) or air (pilots and other flight crew members). The transport visa for aircraft crews is issued only for civil flights (private or charter) other than scheduled flights, whose status is regulated by the ICAO Chicago Convention (and for which an entry visa is not required to enter the Schengen area to carry out their professional activities).

The transport visa is issued to self-employed or employed truck drivers (TIR drivers) and passenger transporters who must travel to Italy for business-related reasons, excluding those with an employment relationship with an Italian employer. Foreign truck drivers are not authorized to drive vehicles registered in Italy or any other European Union country.

Visa applicants are advised to take the following into account:

- the visa applicant must be physically present at the Embassy at the time of submitting the application;
- The Embassy reserves the right to invite the applicant for a personal interview and/or request additional documents to supplement the visa application, if deemed necessary for a more thorough evaluation of the application.

<b>1</b>	<b>Uniform Schengen Visa Application Form</b> duly completed online ( <a href="https://e-applicationvisa.esteri.it/index.html">https://e-applicationvisa.esteri.it/index.html</a> ), printed with barcode and signed in original by the interested party.
<b>2</b>	<b>A recent (no older than six months) passport-sized photo</b> with a white background <a href="#">ICAO</a>
<b>3</b>	<b>Original passport.</b> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• the passport issue date must not be older than 10 years;</li> <li>• the passport must be valid for at least 90 days from the expiry date of the requested visa;</li> <li>• The passport must contain at least two blank pages.</li> </ul>
<b>4</b>	<b>Photocopy of passport.</b>
<b>5</b>	<b>Proof of residence documentation.</b> <i>The proof of residence documentation ONLY for Uzbek citizens is as follows:</i> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Uzbek identity card/domestic passport;</li> </ul>



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	<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• Certificate of residence downloadable from the portal <a href="https://my.gov.uz">https://my.gov.uz</a>.</li></ul> <p>The proof of residence documentation ONLY for non-Uzbek citizens residing in Uzbekistan is as follows:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• A valid and up-to-date residence permit issued by the competent authorities of the Republic of Uzbekistan. The original residence permit must be presented at the visa counter, along with a photocopy to be attached to the visa application. It is preferable that the residence permit be valid for at least 90 days after the return date.</li><li>• work permit issued by the "Migration Agency under the Cabinet of Ministers of the Republic of Uzbekistan";</li><li>• Employment certificate and salary downloadable from the portal <a href="https://my.gov.uz">https://my.gov.uz</a>;</li><li>• Certificate issued by the visa applicant's employer, with original signature and stamp, accompanied by a copy of the signatory's passport and Uzbek identity card. The signature on the certificate must match the signature on the Uzbek passport/identity document. The certificate must state the applicant's place of employment and residential address. If the visa applicant runs a business, a copy of the Chamber of Commerce registration and/or business license must be attached. However, if the visa applicant is not employed and is dependent on a family member, the same documents relating to the dependent family member must be attached to the application, along with a signed original statement from the family member certifying that the visa applicant is dependent, and a copy of the family member's Uzbek passport/identity document;</li><li>• Rental agreement or property deed proving the visa applicant's residency in Uzbekistan, along with electricity and water bills for the last three months in their name. If the visa applicant is not a tenant or owner, they must submit the same documentation in the name of the family member with whom they live, in addition to a copy of the cohabiting family member's passport or identity card.</li></ul>
6	<b>Photocopies of previous Schengen visas issued in the last 3 years.</b>
7	<b>A cover letter and motivation letter signed in original by the visa applicant, detailing the purpose of the trip, length of stay, dates, and itinerary.</b>
8	<b>Documentation issued by the employer in Uzbekistan.</b> <ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• Travel authorization letter, which must indicate the following:<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>– name and qualification of the visa applicant;</li><li>– name, qualification and contact details of the signatory;</li><li>– monthly salary received by the visa applicant and start date of employment;</li><li>– no objection to travel to Italy, specifying the dates;</li><li>– purpose of the trip and detailed information regarding the event to which the visa applicant has been invited;</li><li>– possible assumption of travel and accommodation expenses in Italy;</li><li>– expected date of exit from the Schengen Area.</li></ul></li><li>• Photocopy of the signatory's passport and/or identity card.</li><li>• Documentation certifying the visa applicant's socioeconomic status (electronic employment record and salary) must be submitted through the <a href="https://my.gov.uz">my.gov.uz</a> and/or <a href="https://my.soliq.uz">my.soliq.uz</a> citizen portals. Documentation not provided through these portals will be considered unreliable.</li><li>• Photocopy of the Chamber of Commerce registration and/or commercial license.</li></ul> <p><b>IMPORTANT: <u>Visa applicants cannot sign documents certifying their own employment and financial status.</u></b></p>
10	<b>Documents proving possession of adequate means of subsistence in Uzbekistan.</b> <p>If the visa applicant is employed, the following documents are required:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• Bank statement updated to the last three months for the personal account into which the salary is paid. All bank statements must be printed on bank letterhead and bear the original liquid ink stamp of the bank;</li><li>• internationally accepted credit/debit card statement updated within the last three months;</li><li>• Employment certificate and salary downloadable from the portal <a href="https://my.gov.uz">https://my.gov.uz</a>;</li></ul>

	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>any other document supporting proof of adequate means of subsistence during the intended stay (e.g. bank statements from any additional current accounts).</li> </ul> <p><b>IMPORTANT:</b> <u>Only bank statements issued by credit institutions located in the Republic of Uzbekistan, with a liquid ink stamp, will be taken into consideration (bank statements must not be older than 10 working days from the date of submission of the visa application).</u></p>
11	<p><b>Certificate of health insurance coverage for the entire period of stay in the Schengen Area.</b></p> <p><i>The insurance policy must provide a minimum coverage of €30,000.00, valid throughout the Schengen Area, and must include emergency hospitalization, repatriation for medical reasons, urgent medical care, emergency hospital care, death, and repatriation of the deceased.</i></p>
12	<p><b>Proof of accommodation.</b></p> <p><i>Availability of accommodation can be proven as follows:</i></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>booking confirmation at the accommodation facility.</li> </ul>
13	<p><b>Round trip flight booking.</b></p> <p><i>If the visa applicant intends to travel to other Schengen countries in addition to Italy, based on the declarations made in the cover letter (point 7), he or she must also attach flight and/or train reservations for travel to the other countries.</i></p> <p><b>IMPORTANT:</b> <u>The Visa Office will only process applications submitted no more than six months before the intended travel date and no later than 15 calendar days before the intended travel date. Applications submitted outside the aforementioned time limits will be immediately rejected by the reception staff at the counter. If the application has already been entered into the IT system, the Visa Office will issue the citizen a simplified decision declaring the application inadmissible, return the attached documents, delete the biometric data from the system (if acquired), and refund any fees collected.</u></p>
14	<p><b>Checklist of supporting documents.</b></p> <p><i>The visa applicant must submit this checklist, written in both Italian and a foreign language they understand. The checklist must be printed by the visa applicant and signed in original.</i></p> <p><i>In the event of any discrepancies in interpretation between the version originally drafted in Italian and any other version drafted in any other language, the original Italian version shall prevail.</i></p>

**DECLARATION:**

I understand that failure to submit ALL the documents listed above may result in the denial of my visa application, and that submitting all the documentation listed herein does not automatically guarantee the issuance of a visa.

I understand that the Italian Embassy in Tashkent reserves the right to request additional documents to supplement the visa application, if deemed necessary for a more thorough evaluation of the application.

I understand that the administrative process for processing my visa application must be completed within 15 calendar days (45 days, where applicable, pursuant to Article 23 of the Visa Code) and that my passport will not be returned until the final decision on visa issuance or denial has been issued.

I am aware that, with regard to the interpretation of the contents of this document, in the event of any discrepancies in interpretation between the version originally drafted in Italian and any other version drafted in any other language, the original version in Italian shall prevail.
